The 4 Types of Diabetes

Diabetes isn't a one-size-fits-all condition. While all types involve blood sugar issues, each type has unique causes and treatments. Learn more about the four types of diabetes below.

1. Type 1 Diabetes

- An autoimmune condition where the body attacks insulin-producing cells in the pancreas.
- Most commonly diagnosed in children, teens, and young adults, but can develop at any age.
- Requires daily insulin therapy to manage blood sugar levels.
- **Symptoms:** Frequent urination, increased thirst, unexplained weight loss, blurred vision.

2. Type 2 Diabetes

- The most common form, affecting 90-95% of people with diabetes.
- Occurs when the body develops insulin resistance, leading to high blood sugar.
- Linked to obesity, inactivity, and genetics but can often be prevented or delayed with lifestyle changes.
- Symptoms: Fatigue, slow healing, tingling in hands and feet, increased thirst and hunger.
- Management includes healthy eating, exercise, blood sugar monitoring, and medication if needed.

3. Gestational Diabetes

- Develops during pregnancy and affects 2-10% of pregnancies.
- Caused by hormonal changes that make insulin less effective.
- Increases the risk of high birth weight, early birth, and future type 2 diabetes for both mother and child.
- Typically managed with diet, exercise, and blood sugar monitoring—sometimes requiring insulin.

4. Prediabetes

- A warning sign for type 2 diabetes where blood sugar is elevated but not yet at diabetic levels.
- Affects 1 in 3 Americans, but 84% don't know they have it.
- Reversible with lifestyle changes like increased physical activity and a healthy diet.
